Year 12 students enjoyed a 'Health Day' which included a practical session on how to deliver CPR, given by a real Paramedic who also happens to be one of our lovely ex-students. Students used 'Resuscitation Annies' donated by the British Heart Foundation and enjoyed a careers chat about the role of a Paramedic. Year 12s also had a session learning about Vaccines and Blood Donations - very timely given the Covid vaccine rollout to our young people. Students were able to ask questions and feel more comfortable making their own personal vaccine decisions. Year 12s then took part in a fantastic team building, physical session delivered by the British Army. Working together to solve problems they had to ensure they communicated clearly and involved every member of their team. A really fun session with a fantastic sense of achievement at the end.
